Often, when I call on friends where I have traveled, I will ask, "How are you and your family doing?" The common reply is, "By the grace of God, we are fine." Despite desperate situations, life is better when we choose to find the good and make the best of even the worst of situations. There are hundreds of passages of scripture speaking about joy. Some personal joy comes in the events in one's life. Other joy comes when we celebrate with others. Still other joy comes when we think of the kingdom of God and the peace we find in this life and the life to come.

I am always amazed at the joy of others who

have faced long term disabilities or horrific changes in their life due to accidents. Some find new purpose and direction while others find it difficult to move forward. py, and your joy and you shall form an invincible host against difficulties.

In confession, I am not one who can always find the resolve to keep happy, BUT, I try. God, our Father, desires to take away the sin and pain of the world. It would be right to fill our lives with joy and happiness, with thankfulness for each day before us.

Consider these verses:

2 Corinthians 7:4 I have, in fact, the greatest confidence in you. If only you knew how proud I am of you! I am overwhelmed with joy despite all our troubles.

Psalm 16:11 You make known to me the path of life; you will fill me with joy in your presence, with eternal pleasures at your right hand.

Psalm 28:7 The Lord is my strength and my shield; my heart trusts in him, and he helps me. My heart leaps for joy, and with my song I praise him.

Philippians 1:4 In all my prayers for all of you, I always pray with joy."

What I found in reading through dozens of passages on joy was that "Joy" is NOT dependent on the situation. FINANCIAL UPDATE

A brief financial update as of July 31, 2014 (latest available data at the newsletter deadline):

This chart gives a picture of where we'd expect to be in order to end the year with no deficit, versus where we are for the year-to-date:

From these figures we can observe:

- On the positive side church leadership has been diligent in containing expenditures, and we have been fortunate to avoid excessive unexpected expenses thus far in the year.
- On the not-so-positive side giving continues to lag behind what we would expect to receive if we are to end the year "in the black" and we have spent more than \$60,000 in excess of what has been received in offerings.

We ask that you continue to prayerfully consider how you will share that with which God has blessed you to support the ministry and mission of Calvary Church.




The Cupboard Appreciation Brunch October 4th @ 9:00 AM

CHILDREN OF DESTINY - NICARAGUA

He will respond to the prayer of the destitute; He will not despise their plea. Let this be written for a future generation, that a people not yet created may praise the Lord. Psalm 102-17-18

This was my prayer during the years of construction on our home for babies and toddlers in Los Cedros. Now, years later, I sense the presence of the Lord on our property and on our daily functions. He has responded to the children's cries for help and their suffering. He provided a home and a loving family to daily demonstrate His compassion for them and their value as His children.

Pictured here siblings, Yacareli and Josue, ages ten and four, arrived in Los Cedros a couple



of weeks ago. Their government escort was familiar with our home and was clearly happy to bring them to us. The children arrived with deep sadness in their eyes and were

clearly nervous and skeptical. They wore dirty old clothing and their belongings fit in a small zip lock bag - a few little toys and a pair of mismatched socks. While the official completed the paperwork with our staff, I asked the children if they would like to look around their new home.

We took a short tour of the property, the dining room, team dorm buildings, and finally the playground. They asked me, "Will we be allowed to play on this playground?" I responded, "Certainly, this is your new home!"

Then we walked over to the house where Josh and Diana live next door. The family was out for the day with a team, but all the older children were swimming in the small pool in their back yard. The siblings were fascinated by the sheer fun and delight of it all. I introduced them to two of the nannies that were watching the swimmers. The nannies hugged them and told them that they were going to like living here. They also tried to comfort them by telling them, "Everyone here is going to love you."

The big sister, Yacareli, asked, "Will they really love us or will they throw us away like

trash like our parents did?" We all confirmed that they would be loved! As we walked away they asked, "Will we be allowed to swim in that pool?" Again, I said, "Certainly!"

Early the next morning I returned to Los Cedros. I could hardly believe my eyes. The overnight transformation in both of the children was amazing.

Over the following days I observed them closely. They behaved as if they had always lived with us. They radiated joy on the playground, in the pool, and on the bikes, but most of all at mealtimes! These two reminded me why I do what I do and how much they need us all. I am still amazed at the transforming power of love. Yes, it does take a village to raise these children, and I am honored to partner with you. Please continue to pray for all of the Children of Destiny, Nicaragua and Globe Hope.
